<u>Objectives</u>: The purpose of the large jazz ensemble format is to assist the student in developing his or her improvisational skills through rehearsals and performances.

All Performances are mandatory.

<u>Attire Requirements</u>--Performance attire will consist of dress shirt and tie, or sport jacket and dressy shirt (no tie), or coat and tie for men, and dresses, skirts and blouses, or dressy pant suits for women. This precludes tee-shirts, tank tops, denim jeans, shorts and cutoffs, athletic shoes, thongs and bare feet. Sloppy and poor attire reflects a profound disrespect for the music. Any student who does not meet these requirements will receive a failing grade for the entire course. We are <u>very serious</u> about this.

Attendance Policy

Good attendance is critical to the growth of the individual musician and the group in general. One excused absence is permitted without penalty. All excused absences past the first one carry with them a 2% penalty per absence from the total grade.

An excused absence requires at least a 48 hour notice.

You are responsible for a suitable sub for your chair. It also your responsibility to call the group director (as well if you are subbing out. Make sure that your sub gets the music!

Unexcused absences carry with them a 15% penalty per absence for the first two absences from the total grade. A third unexcused absence is grounds for expulsion from the group with a failing grade.

This policy will be enforced!

Promptness is also very important as well. Late arrivals will be penalized 3% per incident from the total grade.

<u>Grading Parameters</u> Attendance Improvement Jazz Performances*

Students are encouraged to arrange and compose for the ensembles. *These are mandatory performances. Any student failing to perform on any of these concert dates will fail the entire course.
